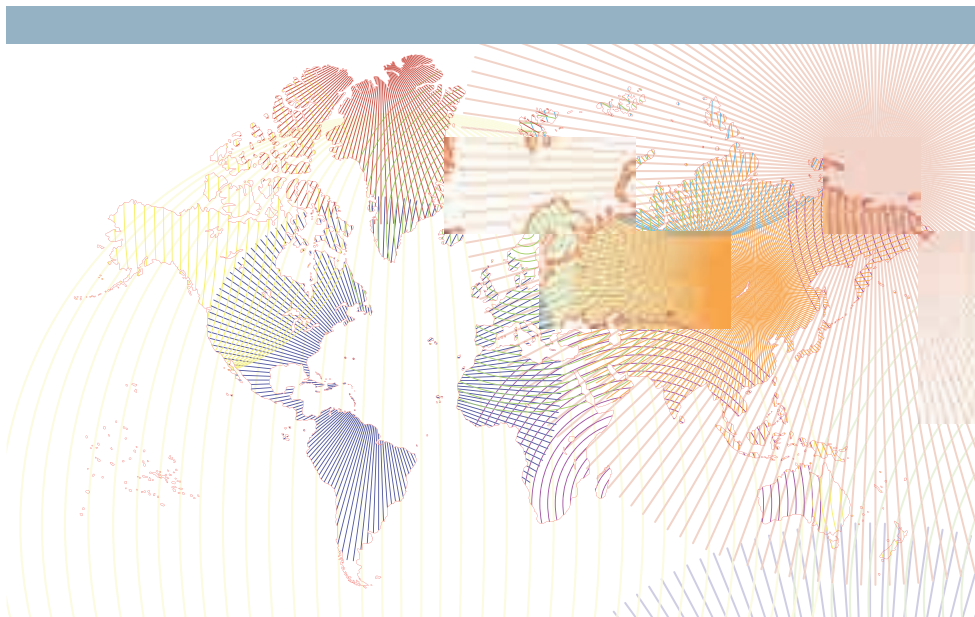

Will I get an internationally recognised qualification?

The University of London has more than 1,800 students in Bangladesh studying through the University of London International Programmes. Our programmes are well respected, both by universities and employers in Bangladesh and around the world. Our graduates gain prestigious jobs in banks, multinational companies and law firms and go on to further study at the world's leading universities.

Is there a programme to suit me?

We offer more than 100 Bachelors and Masters programmes in a wide range of subjects (please see back cover for a full list). Our programmes have flexible study and payment options, enabling you to fit your studies around work and family commitments.

How long will my study take?

You have between:

- one to five years for an undergraduate Diploma
- three to eight years for a Bachelors degree
- six months to five years for a postgraduate certificate or Diploma
- one to five years for a Masters.

How does it work in practice?

You may choose to study independently or receive study support from local teaching institutions. Whatever your method of study, you will be sent an introductory package of study materials, including past examination papers. On most courses you will also have access to online study resources, which will help you to prepare for your exams. You can sit your exams locally at the British Council offices in Chittagong or Dhaka (www.britishcouncil.org/bangladesh).

Entrance requirements and how to apply

Undergraduate entrance requirements

Our general entrance requirements for undergraduate degree programmes are expressed in terms of UK GCE 'A' levels and UK GCSE/GCE 'O' levels. We equate the secondary school leaving examinations taken in Bangladesh (Higher Secondary Certificate or Intermediate Secondary Certificate) as being equivalent to UK GCSE/GCE 'O' levels. Therefore they do not meet our full entry requirements.

The following qualifications are equivalent to our general entrance requirements (you may also need to satisfy programme-specific entrance criteria):

- Passes in two academic subjects at GCE UK 'A' level, with not less than a Grade E in each, plus three Bangladeshi HSCs passed at 60% or above.
- Passes in three academic subjects at GCE 'A' level (with one 'A' level at not less than Grade D and two at grade E)
- An International Baccalaureate (the Diploma)
- An Advanced International Certificate of Education, with a minimum score of 120 points
- A two-year first degree from an acceptable institution in Bangladesh. First degrees of longer duration and postgraduate programmes from acceptable institutions also meet our general entry requirements.

We accept many other qualifications in place of 'O' and 'A' levels and each application will be considered on an individual basis. We require all applicants to demonstrate a certain level of competence in English.

Alternative entry routes

If you do not meet the entrance requirements, the following entry routes are available:

- Access programme: provides entry to the BSc Business Administration and must be studied at the London College of Legal Studies (Gulshan) in Bangladesh.
- Access route: provides entry to LSE-led degrees in the fields of Economics, Management, Finance and the Social Sciences. It can be studied independently or with support from the Dhaka Centre for Law and Economics in Bangladesh.
- Diploma in Law: provides entry to our LLB. You need to study the Diploma at specific teaching institutions, which will advise on their entry criteria (please see pages 6-7).
