# Law Induction Day

Every year, the University of London International Programmes organises a one-day introduction to the LLB and Diploma in Law for newly registered students as well as those who are considering registration.

The course is designed to provide new and prospective Law students with guidance on study and examination techniques. University teachers involved in the International Programmes will discuss syllabuses and answer students' queries on any aspect of studying for the LLB or Diploma in Law.

The speakers will also explain how to use learning and support materials, discuss the University's examination system, analyse past questions and illustrate the type of answers that would score highly. There will also be a session on study techniques appropriate for the study of Law.

If you find that you are unable to attend the Induction Day after you have paid for it, you may be eligible to have part of your fee refunded provided that you tell us that you wish to withdraw at least ten working days before the course. You must apply in writing (enclosing your admission email) to the address above.

## Travel information

The nearest Underground station is **Russell Square** (Piccadilly Line). Other Underground stations nearby include **Euston** (Victoria and Northern Lines) and **Euston Square** (Circle, Metropolitan and Hammersmith & City Lines).

**Euston** station (British Rail mainline) is ten minutes walk from Stewart House; **King's Cross** and **St Pancras** mainline stations are about fifteen minutes walk away.

*Note: on-street parking in Bloomsbury is very limited and is metered on Saturdays. You are strongly advised not to travel by car. Disabled drivers should note that the National 'Blue Badge' Scheme does **not** apply in the vicinity of Stewart House.*

If you are arriving by **air**, it may help you to know that there are relatively inexpensive rail links to central London. From **Heathrow**, Piccadilly underground line trains run directly to Russell Square (the Heathrow Express runs directly to Paddington where you must change to the underground – it is quicker but more expensive); from **Gatwick**, the Gatwick Express runs to Victoria, where you change to the Victoria line to Euston, alternatively (and cheaper) Thameslink trains run from Gatwick to King's Cross (see above); from **Stansted**, the Stansted Express stops at Tottenham Hale where you change to the Victoria line to Euston; from **Luton**, Thameslink trains run directly to King's Cross.
