What are Weekend Courses?

Each year the Undergraduate Laws Programme organises a series of Weekend Courses for International Programmes LLB, Diploma in Law and Diploma in the Common Law students.

The courses have been designed to help you consolidate your knowledge and provide an opportunity to meet the University of London tutors and fellow students.

The following courses are taught at each of the Intermediate weekends:

- Criminal Law
- Public Law
- Common Law Reasoning and Institutions
- Elements of the Law of Contract.

The courses taught at each of the Optional and Compulsory Finals weekends are:

Compulsory Finals:

- Law of Tort
- Land Law
- Law of Trusts
- Jurisprudence and Legal Theory.

Optional Finals:

- Company Law
- EU Law
- Commercial Law
- Family Law
- Evidence
- Intellectual Property.

Course organisation

There will be two lectures and two tutorials for each course. Students will be allocated to tutorial groups on their arrival. Lectures will be attended by all students on a course.

Each Weekend Course covers a different topic and is therefore complete in itself but you will find it very useful to attend all four. The purpose of the courses is to assist you to concentrate on the important areas of your study (especially topics that students find difficult), to introduce new developments, recent and forthcoming legislation, and to help you tackle problems when writing examination answers. Although it is impossible to cover the entire syllabus, you will have an opportunity to raise any particular problems you have encountered in your studies.

It must be emphasised that the inclusion of a topic in a course does not necessarily indicate that this topic will appear on the examination question paper.

The teachers on the courses are drawn mainly from lecturers and tutors who teach at the Laws Schools of the University of London.

Although courses are organised to try to avoid timetable clashes, some are unavoidable. Please be aware of this possibility when booking the courses and consult the timetables available on the VLE from September.

If there are too few enrolments in any course to make it viable, the Undergraduate Laws Programme reserves the right to cancel that course. A full refund will be made should this occur.

How much does it cost?

Each course (two lectures and two seminars) costs **£50**.
