Candidates should answer **ONE** of the following **TWO** questions.

1. Critically analyse and compare the systems of prior informed consent in the provisions of the following treaties: (i) the 2001 Stockholm Convention on Persistent Organic Pollutants; (ii) the 1998 Rotterdam Convention on the Prior Informed Consent Procedure for Certain Hazardous Chemicals and Pesticides in International Trade; and (iii) the 1989 Basel Convention on the Control of International Transboundary Movements of Hazardous Wastes and their Disposal.
  
2. 'As illustrated by the 1973 Convention on International Trade in Endangered Wild Species of Fauna and Flora, trade is an effective tool to foster the conservation and sustainable use of wild life.'
